Financial Director

The following material is a summary of the financial report. A full report is made available to members at the Annual General Meeting.

Generally, most line items were as budgeted after we revised the budget due to the Covid impacted season. The majority of revenue line items adjusted downwards due to the Covid-19 impacted year and season and this change includes any consideration of income and expenses relative to 2019.

- **On Income - Overall decrease 34% - as expected**
 - Canteen (7% of total revenue) ~ revenue decreased 48% relative to 2019
 - Grants (0.3%) ~ \$1,000 Covid Grant NSW Government
 - Parking (24%) ~ small decrease relative to 2019
 - Social Functions (0%) ~ no Social Functions able to be held
 - Subscription fees (42%) ~ revenue decreased 28% relative to 2019 but revenue higher in the 2020 adjusted budget than expected with returning player numbers slightly higher than expected after Covid resumption
 - Turf hire (11%) ~ revenue decreased 58% but as expected
 - Sponsorship (44%) ~ revenue as expected due to Covid impact
- **On Expenses - Overall decrease - as expected**
 - Administration (2% of total expenses) ~ expenses as expected
 - Amortisation (2%) ~ current surface and facilities now written off
 - Association fees (27%) ~ costs down as expected
 - Coaching (14%) ~ as expected
 - Equipment (1%) ~ projected expenditure was reduced to help with Covid impacts
 - Light. Power, Heating (8%) ~ expenses reduced as expected
 - Representative Subsidies (5%) ~ as expected with reduction of 21% relative to 2019
 - Repair and Maintenance (11%) ~ higher than expected but this was offset by an insurance claim which brought expense back in line with the expected level. This area of the club's expenditure remains in a holding pattern, trying to minimise expenditure where possible until the new field outcome is finalised
 - Social events (0%) ~ no functions held
 - Water (2%) ~ costs as expected.

As a result, a Net Profit was generated (approx. \$20k as opposed to \$69k in 2019). This outcome was as expected.

When reviewing the outcomes for the year, we provide the following commentary on the Balance Sheet, noting that generally, most line items were as planned with the additional comments being:

- ***On Assets***

- Fixed assets remain unchanged (less the scheduled annual amortisation) with Surface and Facilities now written off - no new major assets

- ***On Debt***

- Credit Card Facility secured by a term deposit with CBA.

- ***Future Capital expenditure***

- Field relocation plus additional field our contribution unknown currently
- Turf resurfacing, we would hope will not be needed prior to relocation
- Some existing Clubhouse repairs still required subject to timing

Please note, the above commentary is presented here to provide a general summary and highlight significant items and/or outcomes. Approximates and rounding have been used. The above figures are not meant to represent all movements in the Profit and Loss and Balance Sheets.

To conclude, the FY2020 financial results were sound particularly when considering the Covid period, with the overall financial position of the Club as expected with the revised budget. Please note, the Auditor's Report will be handed out with the underlying financials. Furthermore, we are more than happy to discuss any aspect of this report, as well as answer any other financial questions at the AGM.

Women's President's Report

In 2020, Ryde fielded seven teams; five in the Sydney Women's Hockey League (SWHL) and two in the Sydney North competition administered by NWSHA. We had some great results and excellent improvement across all teams. Three teams made it into the SWHL final series and Fifth Grade progressed to the SWHL ML6 Grand Final. While that title did not fall to the team they will take a fantastic 2020 performance into next season. After finishing second, Fourth Grade were knocked out in the semi-final, but again will take this form into next season and will hopefully be promoted to ML4. Seventh Grade, while undefeated through the regular season, were cruelly denied in extra time in the grand final. All of these teams have provided a platform for promising 2021 season.s

In such a short season, there were challenges to fielding our strongest teams each week.
