Financial Director

Generally, most items were as budgeted with the return to our first full season since COVID-19.

- On Income - Overall increase 42% - as expected
 - Canteen (is 12% of total revenue) ~ revenue increased 66%.
 - Grants (1%) ~ Various Covid Grants.
 - Parking (26%) ~ revenue increase 5%.
 - Subscription fees (42%) ~ Up 82%, \$64,800 from 2021.
 - Turf hire (11%) ~ as expected.
 - Sponsorship (5%) ~ revenue where expected.
- On Expenses - Overall Increase 18% - lower than expected.
 - Administration (is 3% of total expenses) ~ as expected.
 - Amortisation (1%) ~ Current surface and facilities now written off.
 - Association fees (33%) ~ some reductions due to COVID-19 credits of around \$10,000.
 - Coaching (14%) ~ figure as expected.
 - Equipment (1%) ~ figure as expected.
 - Light. Power, Heating (6%) ~ lower than expected, THREE months not invoiced till November for an additional \$5000.
 - Representative Subs (7%) ~ as expected.
 - Repair and Maintenance (9%) ~ figure as expected probably similar next year.
 - Water (2%) ~ costs as expected.

As a result, a Net Profit was generated of approximately \$90k which is artificially higher due to COVID-19 related rental rebates we were able to negotiate with the Government of \$27,600.

When reviewing the figures for the year, we provide the following commentary on the Balance Sheet:

- Generally, most items were as planned with the additional comments being:
- On Assets
 - Fixed assets remain unchanged (less the scheduled annual amortisation) with Surface and Facilities now written off.
 - No new major assets

- On Debt
 - Credit Card Facility secured by a term deposit with CBA.
- Future Capex same as previous years
 - Field relocation plus additional field our contribution unknown currently
 - Turf resurfacing and major lighting upgrade or LED replacement
 - Possible clubhouse upgrade

Please note, the above commentary is presented here to provide a general summary and highlight significant items and/or outcomes. Approximates and rounding have been used. The above figures are not meant to represent all movements in the Profit and Loss and Balance Sheets.

To conclude, the FY2022 financial results were sound, particularly when considering the COVID-19 period, with the overall financial position of the Club as expected with the revised budget. Please note, the Auditor's Report will be handed out with the underlying financials at the Annual General Meeting (AGM). Furthermore, we are more than happy to discuss any aspect of this report, as well as answer any other financial questions at the AGM.

Women's President's Report

We all held our breath and hoped that the 2022 season would be a full season. The women gathered in large numbers to attend preseason training and trials and the season was off to a very promising start. Initially we had the intention of fielding eight teams between two competitions, the Sydney Women's Hockey League (six teams) and the Sydney North competition (two teams). As preseason went on and the regular competition grew closer it was decided that Ryde would field seven teams in total, six in the Sydney Women's Hockey League and one in the Sydney North competition. Ryde's sixth grade team were promoted to the Sydney Women's Hockey League as one of the other teams pulled out of ML6. This was the first time in several years that Ryde has field a team in all SWHL Metro divisions.

Player management was a massive challenge this season with new playing regulations around COVID-19 and people unavailable due to travel commitments, school, and representative hockey. Such circumstances made the selection of squads very difficult on a weekly basis. On one occasion we had more players unavailable than available to play! Thank you to those players who played a number of games each weekend to ensure we could field a side in each division.

This season saw several Ryde Juniors make their debut in the senior teams and the future of Ryde is looking bright and competitive for years to come.

Ryde's first grade squad were successful and made the semi-finals only to be knocked out in the finals by the narrowest of margins in extra time and one on ones. Seventh grade had a successful season making the grand final, only to be narrowly defeated in a very close 0-1 result.

Juniors' President's Report

It was fabulous to be back on the hockey field for a full season, the first in a couple of years. There was much anticipation at the beginning of the season, not least of all from Ryde wondering if we were able to maintain the numbers in the juniors. As it turned out we were very lucky compared to many other sports who saw their numbers considerably reduced.

Again, this year we managed to field **17 junior teams** with **204 junior athletes** forming two U7 teams, three U9 teams, three U11 teams, three U13 teams, three U15 teams and three U17 teams, competing across 15 or 16 rounds from March to September. Of the 12 teams in the NA comp (U11-U17s), we had eight teams making the finals and five crowned premiers. A terrific first season back and an excellent base on which to build.

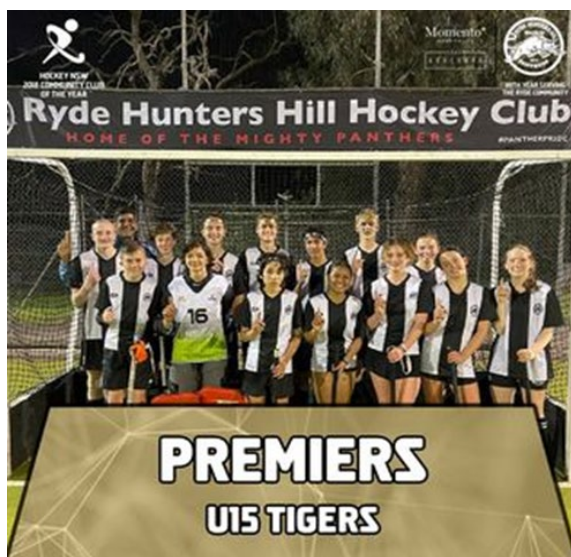

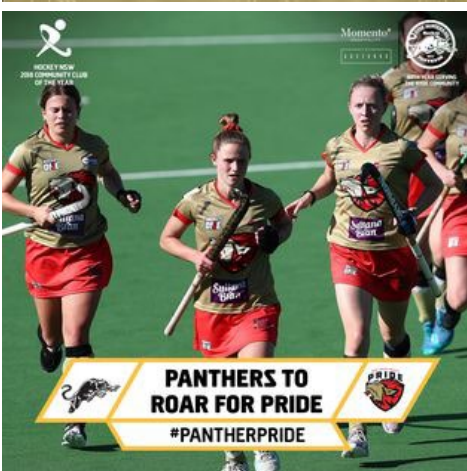
I would like to the opportunity to once again thank Meg Smith and her family who work tirelessly behind the scenes to ensure every event and interaction with our members is a success.

Second Grade

Competition - SWHL ML2

Placing - Sixth

The 2022 season was another rewarding one for the Women's second grade team. Whilst at season's end we finished sixth of ten teams, final placings are only one measure of what makes a successful campaign. When combined together, playing roster, team composition, playing style and coaching staff are key areas which impacted on how the team progressed through the year, as well as the overall result on the final ladder.

Playing roster

Player availability significantly impacted the team. Across the 18 rounds, a combined roster of 30 players was needed to ensure that we could suitably compete. Injury, work, study, representative play, other grade commitments and travel were the main reasons for reduced player availability, which meant that creating stability with playing style fell to a small core group. High attendance at training was positive and this helped to create cohesiveness across the playing roster, as did the mid-season merging of 2s and 3s training sessions.

Team composition

Team composition impacted the season in a range of ways this year, with a limited number of the 30 players in the playing roster playing solely for second grade. Of the main playing group, the following additional contributions were made:

We also welcomed a number of junior players to the roster, with Willow Sewell, Annie O'Hara, Matilda Reitz and Naia Lopez carrying a significant load due to their commitments in the junior club, representative requirements, and their registration in third grade coupled with continued commitment to playing in second grade each weekend. These girls often played at least three games a week and they developed exceptionally well – their contribution to second grade was enormous and was both valued and appreciated.

Special mention should also go to Millie Fulton, Lily Kable and Charlotte Tarleton for their commitment to travel to Sydney each weekend and play across several grades for Ryde once they were here, as well as to play in their own local competitions.

Playing style

Playing style was understandably affected significantly due to our changeable availabilities, and other various impacts (as previously discussed) on individuals each week. Given these ongoing difficult circumstances we pulled together incredibly well as a broader squad and held a stable playing style across the season - this saw us potentially challenging for a fourth-place finish right up to the second last game of the season. Where it did inhibit us, however, was the ability of the team to develop a more sophisticated and competitive playing style which is needed in future to see us positioned securely in a top four position and playing regularly as finals contenders.

Coaching staff

A key strength for second grade this season was the collaborative and cohesive approach to coaching by a number of the Ryde women's coaches. The player/coach scenario (Sharon Coutts) has again worked well with this team, but the invaluable and consistent contribution by Paul Levett (third grade), as well as by Jimmy Birkefeld (first grade) and Nikki Beaton (Ryde women's club coach) benefitted all and added both expertise and cultural richness to the 2s squad. Their time and effort were enormously valued and appreciated by all. A huge thank you must also be extended to the Women's club president Kara Retford for her unwavering support of the women's club coaches throughout the season.

Overall, season 2022 was a rewarding and successful one, particularly given the challenges that the team / squad faced in terms of playing roster, composition and playing style. Despite the significant impacts of each of these, the Ryde women's 2s of 2022 proved each week that they have the potential to challenge all teams at the highest level within the league. With careful planning to mitigate these issues, this squad looks set to continue to build on a positive trajectory in future years.

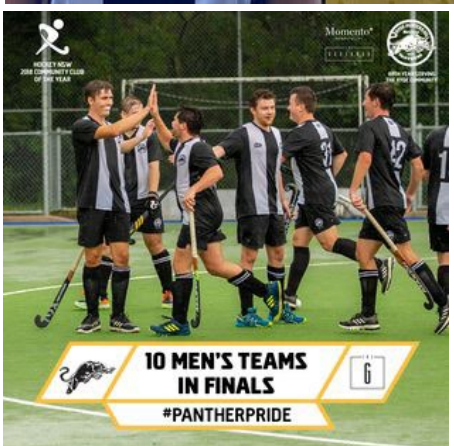
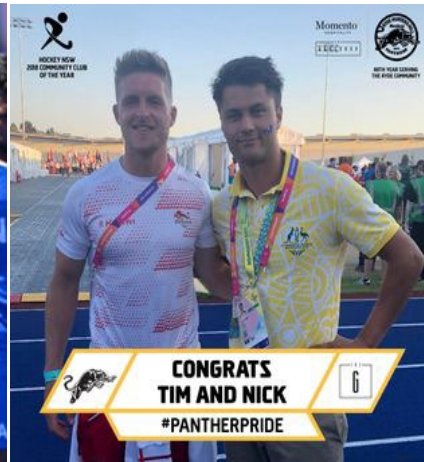
