Financial Director

Generally, most items were as budgeted.

- On Income Overall increase 12% as expected
 - Canteen (is 14% of total rev) ~ revenue increased 37%
 - $\circ~$ Parking (32%) ~ revenue increased 40% additional tenant
 - Subscription fees (35%) ~ Down 4% reduction of teams
 - Turf hire (11%) ~ as expected
 - Sponsorship (4%) ~ as expected
- On Expenses Overall Increase 18% lower than expected
 - Administration (is 3% of total expenses) ~ as expected.
 - Amortisation (1%) ~ current surface and facilities now written off
 - Association fees (30%) ~ as expected
 - Coaching (9%) ~ figure as lower than expected
 - Equipment (1%) ~ figure as expected.
 - Light. Power, Heating (8%) ~ higher than expected across the board increases
 - Representative Subs (7%) ~ as expected
 - \circ Repair and Maintenance (7%) ~ figure as expected, probably similar next year
 - Water (4%) ~ costs as expected

As a result, a Net Profit was generated of approximately \$83k which higher than expected mainly due to additional parking revenue. When reviewing the figures for the year, we provide the following commentary on the Balance Sheet:

- Generally, most items were as planned with the additional comments being:
 - On Assets
 - Fixed assets remain unchanged (less the scheduled annual amortisation) with surface and facilities now written off
 - ➢ New Coffee machine \$8k purchased
 - $\circ \quad \text{On Debt}$

- > Credit Card Facility secured by a term deposit with CBA remains.
- Future Capex same as previous years
 - > Turf resurfacing estimated at \$475k being looked at currently for 2024
 - > Major Lighting upgrade or LED replacement
 - Possible Clubhouse upgrade.

Please note, the above commentary is presented here to provide a general summary and highlight significant items and/or outcomes. Approximates and rounding have been used. The above figures are not meant to represent all movements in the Profit and Loss and Balance Sheets.

To conclude, the FY2023 financial results were good, with the overall financial position of the Club as expected. Please note, the Auditor's Report and underlying financials will be available to those members who attend the AGM., we are more than happy to discuss any aspect of this report, as well as answer any other financial questions at the AGM.

Juniors' President's Report

Another fabulous hockey season from our Ryde Juniors! We are very proud to be one of the biggest and most successful Junior clubs in Sydney and this year Ryde delivered again, winning the North Area Junior Club Championship for the 19th successive year!

Ryde Juniors fielded an incredible **211 Junior Athletes** an increase from last year, and we formed **16 Junior Teams**:

- 1 x U7 Minkey Team;
- 2 x U9 Minkey Teams;
- 4 x U11 Teams;
- 3 x U13 teams;
- 3 x U15 teams;
- 3 x U17 teams.

Our hockey season is run by North Area Junior Hockey, which includes the clubs from our association North West Sydney and the Northern Sydney and Beaches Association, as well as Briars from Sydney East Hockey Association. Clubs that you all no doubt be familiar with include Baulkham Hills, Briars, Gordon North Sydney, Manly Warringah, Mosman, Northern Districts, UTS, Wenty and of course Ryde. The Metro competition for the U15 and U17 A divisions also includes Glebe, Sutherland, Moorebank-Liverpool and UNSW. The season ran from mid-march through 15 or 16 rounds of competition culminating in finals in September.

Ryde Juniors had 6 teams into the Grand Finals and a further 3 into Semi Finals. Fabulous achievements across all the age groups, as follows:

Coaching Director

My report addresses a number of initiatives and developments through 2023 and identifies areas for discussion for 2024.

Women's Program

The 2022 program work with coaches continued, well led and initiated by Kara Retford. There was increased cohesion and commitment to agreed principles and processes. 
Coach and Athlete Development Plan - Key focus for 2024

In total, a squad of 19 players. The pre-Season competition of three games saw Ryde lose two games and draw one. A similar start to the 2022 season, that highlighted defensively we were looking solid, but scoring was more difficult.

The main competition was made up of six teams with two teams coming down from Sydney Cup and weaker teams dropping from the Masters grade 2022 season. The teams in the competition looked very even. The consensus of the brains trust was to make sure we beat two teams we thought we should beat and pick up a couple of other wins. This objective gave the team a reasonable expectation of making the semis and seeing how it played out from there.

The main Competition played out as expected, with all teams very competitive and games score lines typically very close with no blow outs. I would like to start by acknowledging the contribution that Stephen Graham made to the Ryde Hunters Hill District Hockey Club Grand Masters (formerly named Legends) team over a number of years with his diligent work to build, unite and manage this team. I was pleased to take over a diverse group of "young" gentlemen, men who enjoy each other's company as well as taking the field to play hockey together, for the love of the game and the fitness benefits in our twilight sporting years. Unfortunately, Steve's back has failed him and he is no longer able to play hockey. Both his on and off-field contributions are missed. He was able to develop the team's resilience, resulting in the team members producing determined playing performances.

In 2023 the playing year started well for the Grand Masters team. We navigated the pre-season competition impressively, going through undefeated, and we took out the title for the first time. We were fortunate to have good playing numbers so we used our bench well to overpower the opposition teams with ongoing forward surges, while also taking advantage of a small number of skilled players returning to hockey, each after a notable number of years out of the game. For the season-proper we lost these returning players to either promotion or to injury, and that took some of the edge off our early season superiority.

In recent past seasons we had struggled to string together sequences of match wins. Buoyed by the pre-season victory we went into the season-proper with the confidence that we would be able to improve our past track record, putting successive wins together, and this confidence wasn't unjustified. All six teams in the competition were well matched in skill and endurance but four teams emerged, including Ryde, as clearly stronger than the other two. There was plenty of arm-wrestling going between these teams with Northside emerging early as the oneto-beat. Although we played well against them in the pre-season competition we were unable to get the better of them during the premiership season, although one other team did come out with a match win over them, and we managed a draw against them early in the season.

As the season progressed we were finding it more difficult to score goals at critical times. 

As Masters Co-ordinator, Steve Reilly was very helpful with his guidance during the season too so I'd like to thank him for this. I'd also like to acknowledge the efforts of the board of the Sydney Masters Hockey Association, resulting in the smooth running of the competition at Sydney Olympic Park throughout 2023.

We look forward to the team gaining new "young" talent in 2024 as players from the Masters League cross the 55 year old barrier and become eligible for "promotion" to Grand Masters! There is a sound foundation in place, as well as the potential for an infusion of new players, positioning the team well to be at the top-end of the competition next year.
